

King's Goblet 2022 General Information

Tournament structure

Group stage

The King's Goblet tournament consists of one large group stage, where each pair will play 5 matches against 5 different pairs.

At the end of the group stage, all pairs will be ranked according to:

- Number of matches won
- The ratio of Total Games Won to Total Games lost
- Result between the teams (if applicable)
- Coin toss or draw lots

Knock-out stage

The top 8 teams will progress to the knock-out phase on Sunday afternoon. The knock-out phase comprises 4 quarter finals, 2 semi finals and the final.

Each match is timed to last 35 minutes. This *includes* two minutes of knock-up time. The game score when the buzzer goes off will determine who wins the match.

- In the *group stage* if the game score is equal, the match shall be concluded as a tie and each pair awarded half a win.
- In the *knockout stage* if the game score is equal, we will finish the current game (and go slightly over time).

Schedule

We have circulated a detailed schedule of fixtures separately, to help you plan your tournament. The timings for the tournament are:

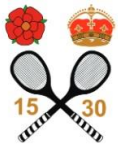

General tournament rules

As one of the few real tennis courts open to the general public, tourists will have access to the side gallery corridor at the Royal Tennis Court between 10am and 5.30pm on every day of the tournament. You should be aware that while the Club does its best to ask visitors to be quiet during play, this cannot be guaranteed. For safety reasons, we kindly ask that the door from the side gallery corridor onto the court is locked during warm-up and play.

Please ensure that you wear predominantly white clothing.

As an open handicap tournament with a range of handicaps participating, we remind players to play within the spirit of the game, taking into account the ability of your opponents (e.g. appropriate forcing at targets). Anyone flouting this rule will be given a warning first, followed by the loss of a game. This rule also includes timewasting.

The court floor will be cleaned periodically during the tournament.

There is no handicap cap for either individuals' handicap, nor the combined team handicap. Differences in handicap will be calculated first before rounding to the nearest number. We will use your doubles handicap for the tournament. The RTC Professionals reserve the right to alter handicaps at the end of the group stage.

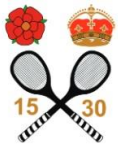
Please ensure you arrive in good time for your fixture. You should be ready to go on court 10 minutes before the start time of your fixture. Remember that time on court to warm up is limited, so you may wish to begin warming up before stepping onto court.

If you arrive late for your match, you will be penalised one game for every 2 minutes you are late. If you are more than 15 minutes late, you will forfeit the match and the match will be recorded 7 games to 4 to the opposition.

In the event of a retirement due to injury during a match, the match shall be awarded to your opponent and the game score will be recorded 7 games to 4. If a player withdraws due to injury during the group stage, a stand-in is permitted, of any handicap, but cannot be someone already in the tournament. Your combined handicap will change accordingly.

Parking facilities and directions

The Royal Tennis Court has no allocated car parking of its own; you should use the car park provided by the Palace. However, please be aware that at busy times (especially at weekends and even more especially in the summer) the car park can fill up quickly. This is particularly acute on Sunday mornings between 10am-12pm when the Palace Chapel holds its Sunday service. We cannot delay fixtures in the event of players failing to find a parking space – the retirement and forfeiture rules will apply. Security guards at the gate can advise nearby car parks.

We advise against players leaving cars in the Hampton Court Palace car park overnight.

The nearest railway station is Hampton Court (700m door-to-door). It is in London Travelcard zone 6, and Oyster and contactless cards can be used. Trains run every half hour and take 36 minutes from London Waterloo. There are currently no engineering works scheduled for the weekend.

Shower and changing facilities

While both changing rooms have shower facilities, we do not provide towels or toiletries. Both changing rooms have hair dryers.

Security

To enter the club via Tennis Court Lane, you will need to go past the security post (see map), who should have your name on the door. More information on security can be found here:

As the main corridor is open to the public, the changing rooms and toilets are accessed via a security code. Please ask the Professionals or an RTC member for the code. This code also opens the entrance to the club rooms via The Wilderness garden.

Champagne Reception and BBQ

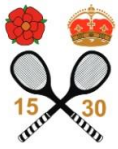

Tournament Dinner

The tournament dinner will take place on Saturday 29th May at Zizzi's Italian Restaurant, Hurst Road, Hampton Court. It is located on the other side of the river, a 5 minute walk from the Main Gates. The cost of food and some drinks are covered under the cost of the tournament entry. Extra drinks must be paid for separately. Dress code is casual.

During the tournament

On all four days:

- A cold buffet and jacket potatoes will be served for lunch.
- Cakes and nibbles will be served for afternoon tea.

There will be sausage baps for breakfast on Friday, Saturday and Sunday of the tournament

The club is cashless and you will be invoiced for any drinks or snacks from the club bar. Please ensure you sign for any drinks or snacks that you take from the bar. You will be invoiced via the email address you gave when you signed up for the event.

There are limited places still remaining for both tours, please get in touch if you would like to join a tour.

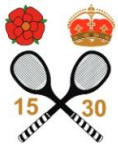

You are welcome (and encouraged!) to enjoy the Palace's formal gardens when not playing in the tournament – please use the exit in the side gallery corridor. Please be aware if you wish to go around the Palace itself, you should purchase tickets separately. We will buy tickets for you if you are going on a tour.

Fun and games off-court

During the tournament, we will have side games that we want everyone to enjoy:

- Target sweepstake: we will be running a sweepstake on the total number of targets (dedans, grille, winning gallery) hit during the tournament. Please submit your guesses along with your dinner choices. The person with the closest guess wins £50; the runner up wins a bottle of wine.
- Chase bingo: in the final, we will run a 'chase bingo' game. The first person to get 4 in a row on their bingo card will win two bottles of wine.
